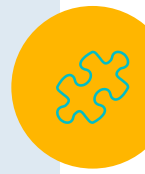

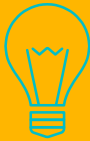

Appendix M: Test Irregularity Examples

The following scenarios provide some examples and non-examples of testing irregularities. This is not an all-inclusive list. Please contact the Assessment Department at (702) 799-1041, for test security concerns not appearing on this list.

Examples of Testing Irregularities

- A student is ill during testing and does not return to finish the test.
- A student is talking during testing (content is irrelevant).
- A student gestures an answer or touches another student's test materials (answer sheet/booklet or computer screen/keyboard).
- A student is not given a testing accommodation that is identified in their IEP.
- A student logs in with a different student's login and password.
- A student accesses or attempts to access a cell phone or smart watch during test administration.
- A student has an electronic device on their person during test administration.
- A student removes test materials from the testing room.
- A student is tested with the wrong test.
- A student is tested at the wrong grade level.
- A student takes the same test twice during an administration.
- A fight breaks out during test administration.
- A student takes a picture of their screen and sends a text of the picture to their friend.
- Students take unsupervised breaks.

- **Cell phone / smart watch / electronic device**
- **Talking to a peer while testing**
- **Gestures to another student during testing**
- **Removes test materials from testing room**



Late students



1) Bus is late- we will let the teachers know to hold testing unless it will be long, then all late students from bus will be proctored by alternate testing proctor...

2) Walk in after 9:10 am to testing...Report to OSS... Student will be walked to class if instructions have not started ...,student will enter.. If started..back to OSS
